5 Module Overview

The programme's primary aim, central to its philosophy, is to equip students for a career in the music profession as performers or composers. The Professional Portfolio module aims to provide a framework in which students can identify and develop both the skills and materials that they will need after graduation.

This module aims to guide students in their career aspirations [aim 7] by developing a rationale and plan for the year 4 Final Project, and identifying skills they will need to achieve those aspirations; and to enable them to develop particular areas of specialism in relation to their project plans [aim 8], while promoting a self-directed approach that encourages self-reliance and responsibility for their personal and professional development [aim 9].

In addition, many Conservatoire graduates will also teach as part of their professional life, and students in the third year of the programme study the pedagogical aspects of their first-study discipline as an important aspect of preparing them for the profession [aim 1]. This equips them with additional skills which are likely to prove useful in a future career in the profession [aim 10].

This module also continues to prepare musicians for the profession in respect of the personal and interpersonal skills required in the cooperative and collaborative environment of professional music making [aim 11], and the qualities and attributes necessary for a career as a professional musician. In order to be employable, musicians have to be reliable, committed, prepared and punctual. It is essential for the intending professional musician to maintain a professional outlook and appreciate the nature of the music profession's environment with its responsibilities and etiquettes.
