5 Module Overview

Relationship with Programme Philosophy and Aims

Programme aims addressed through this module:

- To prepare musicians for the profession (aim 1);
- To develop high standards of musicianship and technique (aim 3);
- To provide a culture and environment for students to develop improvisatory processes (aim 5).
- To cultivate an appreciation of key historical concepts and analytical processes to enrich performance (aim 7);
- nurture the creativity of our students (aim 2)
- develop academic autonomy through the implementation of appropriate research skills (aim 6)

Jazz music has developed and continues to develop as an aural tradition. Part of this tradition is that the language of past masters and leading exponents of the music are absorbed through a musical process of imitation and assimilation. A performer's analytical abilities and the schemes of work derived from these form the basis of a personal and artistically driven practice regime. It is through this process that jazz musicians acquire new improvisatory approaches and enrich their vocabulary. In this module the student is asked to engage with the process of transcription, replication, analysis, assimilation, improvisation.

6 Indicative Content

The exact content is decided upon by the student in negotiation with the module tutor. The student is to choose one improvised solo for the purposes of following this module. The student is to consider his/her own artistic aims and choose to transcribe something appropriate to their individual aspirations.
