

### Hello.

welcome to the Academy of Fine Arts in Nuremberg! Here are some facts and informations that will help you to organize your stay.

The Academy of Fine Arts in Nuremberg, founded in 1662 as the first school of art in Germanspeaking central Europe, sees itself as a lobratory engaged in unrestricted research and creativity. Liberal and applied arts constitute the main areas of instruction. In the classes for Liberal Arts, Fine Arts, Sculpture, Painting, Artistic Concepts, Art Education, Gold- and Silversmithing as well as for Graphic Design/ Visual Communication the professors and students carry out candid discussions.

The Academy tries to make all the forms and expressions of contemporary artistic practice possible and to comprehend these in their proper social and historical-critical contexts. The basis of such an education is the encouragement of each student's individual development. Creative discourse thrives upon differing aesthetic point of view. For this reason, specialists from a wide variety of disciplines are regularly invited as guests changing appointments and the guest professorships stimulate and broaden the spectrum of artistic endeavor.

At the beginning of a regular academic studies at the adbk each student is assigned to one specific class. The same applies for erasmus+ students.

You will work on your own artistic pieces and also join the class meetings. In those you and your classmates are going to discuss and talk about your works. In addition, it is also warmly recommended to join workshops and lectures. It is also possible to join occasionally other class meetings, if you're interested in it. Feel free to ask their professor. The presentations and the examination times are

determined by the respective professor. If you're going to stay until or even in the summer semester, there will be also the possibility to participate in the final exihibition at the end of the course period.

## the adbk campus:

You can ask Brigitte Bredl and Constanze Boscher everything concerning administration affairs — they will always do their best to help you out. At the office you can enroll and also get the pattern (courses confirmation) for the credits. Each should be signed and filled out by your professor after the course. The opening hours are from 8 am until 12 pm. If you have some urgent concern you can also go there in the afternoon.

If you have questions about your learning agreement or questions concerning your ECTS you can go to Claudia Rieber, who is in contact with your home univeritsy. She is responsible for the examination office and also the international office (0911/9404-116, auslandsamt@adbk-nuernberg.de). Her student assistant will support you during your stay in Nuremberg and at the campus. Please feel free to ask her or him everything. She or he will also guide you through the campus.

Mr. Franz (0911/9404-101), Mr. Kaya (0911/9404-102), Mr. Konopik (0911/9404-103) are our caretakers. Besides the skilled manual work, they are also re-sponsible for the opening and closing of the buildings. During the course period they will close the pavilions and gates at 7 pm and at 5 pm in the no lecture break. When the gates are closed you're only able to enter and leave the academy by the gate near the "Wohnstift" building.

library

The adbk library is well-resourced. At your first time there you have to register. There are some books which are not allowed to lend out. The reason for that is that they should be available at anytime for every student. Those books are marked with a red dot. If you are searching for something special, you can use the computer there or also ask Martina Kemmsies who is responsible for the library.

dia librar

The media library accommodates a numerous collection of video art - nearly 1000 tapes. You can search them with their artist name, genre or by notes. It is a great supplement to the library. To get to the media library you have to pass the library until the backroom that Martina Kemmsies will gladly unlock for you. Please notice that the videos can only be watched there.

large-size working

There is a special project room at the campus for large-size and interdisciplinary work. If you are interessted in using a part of the room you have to sign your name, contact and your required space on the schedule. A schedule will be haning at the door for each month at the door. The maximum time for using the room are three months.

Lena Rößner and Petra Meyer are responsible for contentrelated and organisationally coordination and communcation of the program of events. If you are going to plan an exhibition or event you can contact them. The student assistent will send a weekly newsletter to all students during the course period with current exhibitions, lectures, jobs, tenders and so on. If you'd like to buy or sell some art materials or want to share informations you can write an e-mail to the student assistant, he or she will present the inormations in the newsletter in the following week (presse2@adbk-nuernberg.de).

If you want to eat in the mensa you can get yourself a mensacard in exchange for five Euros. At the recharge terminal you can load money onto it. Generally the mensa offers two main warm dishes, one with meat and one vegetarian dish. If you have some questions about the card or the food feel free to ask Herta Marx there.

The Academy has a large archive with technical equipment. You can lend out a projector, slide projector, monitors, flatscreens, etc. If you want a proper overview you can ask the caretakers or Bernd Klausecker (Room 44) about it.

The primary spoken language at the adbk is german. Therefore it's very important for the class meetings to know the basics of german conversation like A1, A2. The required language is english. The academy offers a german language course for free. The dates and the room number will be announced at the beginning of a semester.
