	- pay the 70 EURO deposit via bank transfer, if
	possible, and bring a proof of payment.
Insurance	As health insurance is mandatory in Belgium,
	Hasselt University insists that all students are
	covered with insurance for the full period of their
	stay. Furthermore, we strongly advise students to
	subscribe to some form of hospitalization and
	repatriation insurance, as far as it is not included in
	your health insurance.
	- <u>EU Students</u> are typically covered through
	their local insurance and EHI-card.
	- <u>All NON-EU Students</u> should enrol into the
	SIP (Student Insurance Programme) at
	www.sipinsurance.eu which costs 40

EUR/month. This is a comprehensive insurance, covering civil liability, repatriation, health and accident insurance. After payment of the fee, you will receive a certificate that you should upload into your student file. Please make sure you use the exact same name and surname as for your enrolment at Hasselt University. If you have any further questions about insurances, please contact Mr. Marc Thoelen (marc.thoelen@uhasselt.be). A visa should be applied for at the Belgian Embassy or consulate in the home country well in advance. Please check the website of the Federal Foreign Affairs Department to find out whether you need a visa to come to Belgium. If you need a visa, you will have to prove your

solvency. This solvency can be proved in different ways:

- A document certifying that the student has been awarded a study grant or scholarship
- -"An agreement for acceptance of financial responsibility" (letter of a guarantee) by the socalled Annex 32
- A proof of your own financial means by transferring a certain amount to a blocked bank account in Belgium on your name In case you would like to use the last option (prove your own financial means), Hasselt University can assist you and provide you with a letter of proof of solvency.
